NICARAGUA

A CENTRAL AMERICAN ADVENTURE



JESSICA DE GIER
Tour Leader

As a tour leader in Mexico and Central America for over 25 years, Jessica de Gier tells us why the lesser-known gem of Nicaragua is a country that will always be close to her heart.



I have been leading tours through Nicaragua for the past two decades – witnessing the evolution of tourism in the region, and how Nicaragua has moulded itself into the country it is today.

What moves me most is that Nicaragua has some of the most spectacular nature in all of Central America. The landscapes are magical: dotted with volcanoes – one more active than the next – and lush with jungle and wetlands. Monkeys roam freely in the wild, gardens are verdant and packed with exotic flowers, and birds and butterflies are easy to spot. The tropical beaches on the Atlantic are still untouched and just waiting to be discovered.



UNIQUE EXPERIENCES CAN BE HAD ACROSS THE COUNTRY

Take a traditional ferry across the wide expanse of Lake Nicaragua to Ometepe Island, an island formed by two volcanoes, and have all kinds of active adventures – from kayaking through wetlands and climbing 1,610m up the tallest peak to walking through a forested isthmus to see all sorts of indigenous wildlife in their native habitat.

Back on the mainland, you can drive up the Masaya volcano to the stunning Laguna de Apoyo, a swimmable crater

lake formed thousands of years ago by a volcanic eruption, now situated within the Apoyo Lagoon Natural Reserve.

And, just minutes from Granada's town centre lie the verdant Isletas. Filled with jungle and wildlife, you can kayak around these small islets to take in their sights or take a boat ride around sunset with scenic markers like Granada's Cathedral, Mombacho volcano and, the smoking Masaya volcano turning the setting into something otherworldly.



THE PEOPLE OF NICARAGUA ARE WARM AND WELCOMING

For me personally, this is always a highlight when visiting a country. People are what makes a culture, and you will find Nicaraguans kind and passionate about their beautiful nation. Life in Nicaragua makes the most of the simple things and when the simple things are this wonderful, you'll find yourself making the most of it too.



WHEN IT COMES TO CUISINE, THE FOOD IN NICARAGUA IS DELIGHTFUL

Vegetarians and vegans will find lots of inspiring options, and locally produced beef and seafood dishes are exceptional. Must-try dishes include gallo pinto, the Nicaraguan take on rice and beans, nacatamales, usually pork with vegetables, rice or potatoes wrapped in a banana leaf and vigorón, a traditional dish featuring yucca, pork crackling and, cabbage salad. The national cocktail is nica libre, a refreshing mix of fresh lime juice, Flor de Caña rum and Latin cola; and the local beer is the equally smooth Toña lager.

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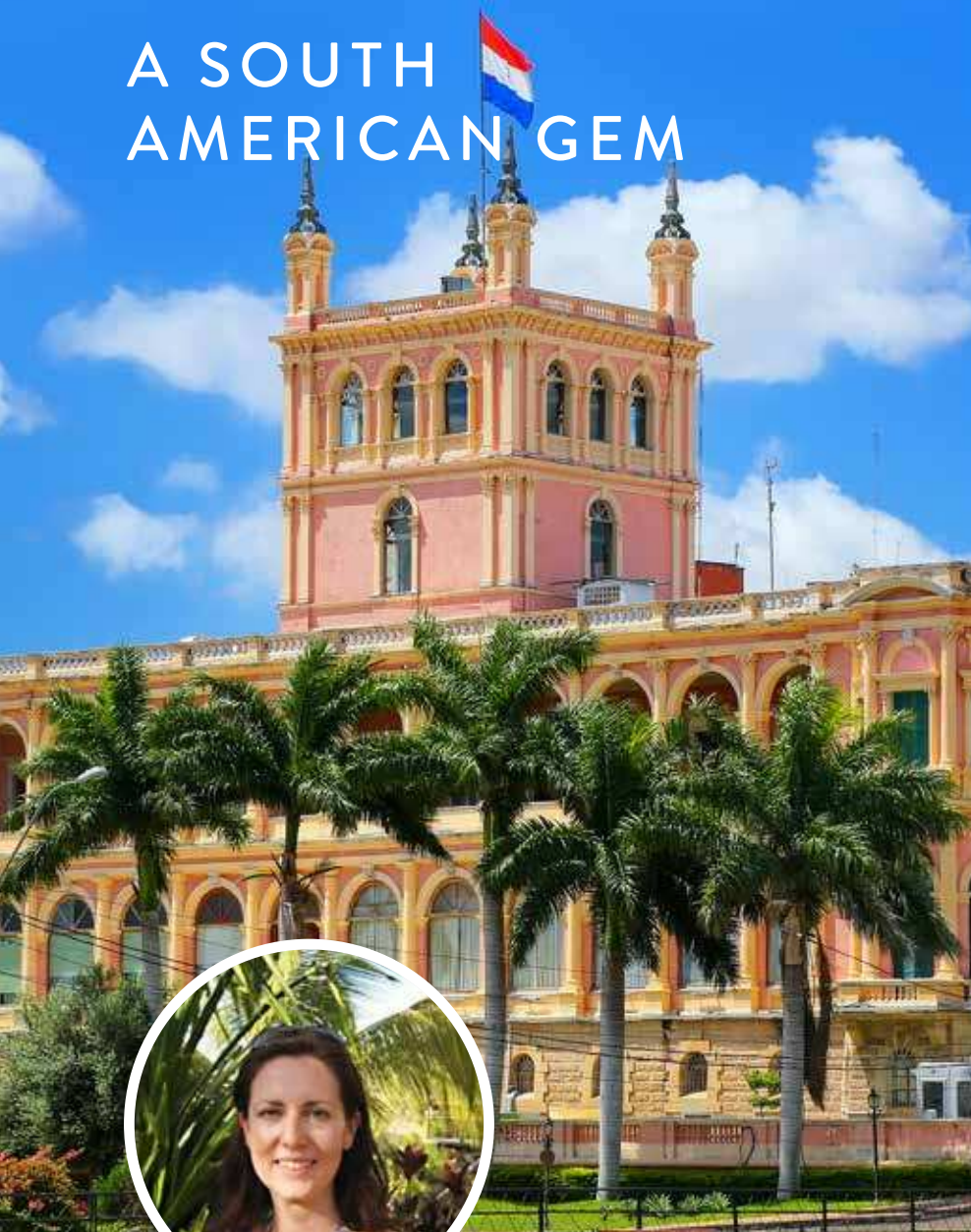

A SOUTH AMERICAN GEM



ELIZABETH LUCK
Tour Leader

Based in South America for over a decade, Liz Luck shares why Paraguay – still largely under the travel radar – remains one of her favourite places to return to again and again.

“

I have been travelling through Paraguay for the past ten years – watching the country steadily open up while still holding on to what makes it so unique.

Paraguay surprises me every time. It's quiet, authentic, and completely unspoilt by tourism. I love that you can cross in from Brazil or Argentina and suddenly feel like you've stepped into somewhere totally different – where time slows down and everyday life feels grounded and sincere.

WILD LANDSCAPES, RARE WILDLIFE

The country's varied geography makes it ideal for adventurous travellers. In the north, the Chaco is a wild expanse of palm forests, cactus-covered plains and wetlands teeming with birdlife. It's like a quieter version of Brazil's Pantanal. You can spot spoonbills, flamingos and giant storks – all without the crowds around.

Head south and the scenery shifts again. Here, rolling green hills and sleepy towns frame Paraguay's famous Jesuit Missions – striking red-stone ruins that feel more like forgotten temples than tourist attractions.



THE REAL SOUTH AMERICA

For many, Asunción is the starting point when travelling to Paraguay. The country's capital infuses its faded colonial charm with a fresh, modern energy. It's one of the oldest cities on the continent, but also one of the most exciting. There's real momentum here – creative restaurants, boutique hotels, and museums that showcase the country's Indigenous roots.

One of my top picks is the Museo del Barro, which brings together Paraguayan history through ceramics, textiles and folk art.



A CULTURE THAT STAYS WITH YOU

What gives Paraguay its distinctive feel is the strength of its Guaraní culture – still spoken, sung and tasted in everyday life. From the national drink tereré (a cold, herbal infusion) to chipa (a warm, cheesy cassava bread), the influence of Indigenous traditions is ever-present.

You'll see people carrying their tereré kits everywhere – it's such a part of the culture, there's a wonderful rhythm to life here.



A PLACE FEW OTHERS REACH

What stands out most for me is how few people actually travel here. Paraguay feels like South America before mass tourism – and I mean that in the best way. You can explore waterfalls, missions, bird reserves or markets and have it all to yourself.

Its understated authenticity is what makes the country special. If you're curious, open-minded and want to experience something different – Paraguay will reward you in ways you didn't expect.

ROB DOVER
Tour Leader

Based in Chachapoyas since the late '90s, Rob Dover has spent over two decades exploring and guiding in the north of Peru. He shares why this lesser-visited region offers some of the most surprising travel experiences in the country.

I have been leading tours through Northern Peru for over 20 years, witnessing the gentle rise of tourism in the region, and how the north has remained true to its roots while slowly opening up to the world.

What I love about Northern Peru is its sheer variety – it feels like several countries in one. You can start your trip by dipping your toes in the Pacific, cross golden deserts, climb into the misty Andes, and end up floating down an Amazonian river, spotting monkeys in the trees. Not many places pack in this much contrast.



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A JOURNEY THROUGH CHANGING LANDSCAPES

Travelling through Northern Peru feels like following a shifting story. One moment you're driving between cactus-covered hills and ancient adobe cities, the next you're weaving through mountain roads where waterfalls tumble into canyons deeper than the Grand Canyon.

At one end of the journey lies Gocta, one of the tallest waterfalls in the world. Hidden in cloud forest for centuries and not officially recognised until 2006, it's now a stunning hike – and on dry days, standing beneath its 542m drop means being gently cooled by a fine mist. On wetter days, it roars like a mountain storm.

PERU ON A PLATE

Northern Peru's food is just as diverse as its landscapes. Along the coast, ceviche is king, while inland favourites include arroz con pato (rice with duck) and slow-cooked goat stew. In Cajamarca, don't miss the warming green soup, a local classic made with potatoes, cheese, egg and herbs – always served with crusty wood-fired bread.



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EXPLORE LOST CITIES IN THE CLOUDS

The town of Chachapoyas makes a great base for exploring the archaeological riches of the region. Towering above it is Kuelap – a vast mountaintop stone citadel built by the Chachapoya people and once one of the largest pre-Columbian sites in the Americas. These days, a scenic cable car glides visitors up the valley to its gates, where thick stone walls and sweeping views reveal just a glimpse of the mysteries it still holds.

Nearby, a visit to Leymebamba offers something truly unique – a museum housing mummies, ceramics and textiles discovered in cliffside tombs beside a remote lake. The finds were astonishingly well preserved, and offer a rare window into a lost world.

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RIVER ADVENTURES WITHOUT THE HEAT

For a taste of the Amazon without the intense heat of the lowlands, I would recommend the Santa Elena Reserve near Moyobamba. It's a beautiful place, gentle and full of life. Local families take visitors along the river in canoes, pointing out capybaras, butterflies, frogs and birds along the way.

At 900m above sea level, the forest here is cooler and less humid – making it a relaxed and accessible way to explore the edge of the high Amazon.



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In Chachapoyas, the market is brimming with colourful vegetables and tropical fruit. On the jungle side of the Andes, dishes often feature local jerkys, fish or beef, served with plantains or cassava – a true taste of the Amazon frontier.

The adventure continues along a bumpy road to the cloud forest. Explore suspension bridges over deep canyons in the lush Selvatura Park, while in the Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve keep your eyes peeled for resplendent quetzals and howler monkeys among the misty foliage.

Days 10-12

Head for the tropical dry forests of the Pacific coast. In Carara we'll view bright scarlet macaws and crocodiles basking along the Tárcoles River, before taking a cooking class. Drink in panoramic views over the forest from our lodge, explore hiking trails or try bird-watching.

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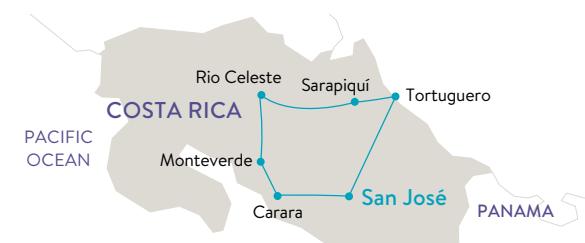

In these beautiful surroundings, relax in the shady plazas and enjoy the natural scenery on the river banks on an included boat trip.

Days 14-16

You'll be charmed by romantic Cartagena, with its brightly painted buildings, labyrinth cobbled streets and floral balconies. Soak up its atmosphere on a guided tour of the 16th and 17th century palaces, churches, leafy plazas and imposing mansions.

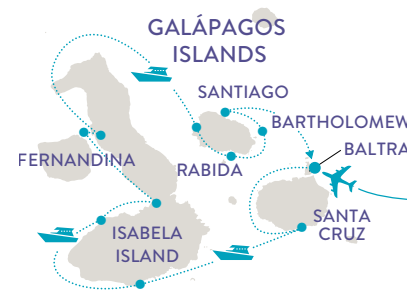

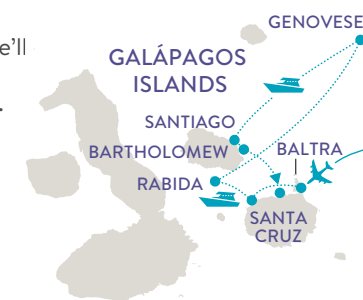

Enjoy a scenic drive past glistening lakes and river gorges to Leymebamba. Discover mummies in the Chachapoyan museum and red pictographs in Revash, then head to Tingo. The cable car ride to Kuelap, a majestic mountaintop city, is a highlight.

Visit the village of Huancas, then hike to the burial site of Karajia and to the base of the Gocta Falls, staying at a lodge overlooking the cascade. Continue into the Amazon basin via the scenic Abra Patricia route before visiting the Santa Elena Reserve, where monkeys, sloths, and countless bird species are often seen.

When you're out on your boat trip the southern right whales can come up so close to the boat that you can see the detail of their barnacle encrusted heads. It's truly mesmerising watching them in the water.

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Days 1-5

Here we really do need to blow our own trumpet. Many of these extensions are fully flexible, in terms of what you do, where you stay and how you get there. Others, such as cruises or treks, necessarily follow a fixed route.

None are escorted by your tour leader; where appropriate they will be led by an English-speaking local guide, with relevant expertise. A sample of what we can offer is featured here, and popular extensions are listed on our website. In addition, our Travel Experts are well-placed to offer various alternatives, and help put together the perfect trip for you.

Over the following pages we suggest a variety of extensions: relaxing at a modern spa, or on a palm-fringed beach; spotting wildlife; walking or driving through outstanding scenery; seeking out historical or contemporary culture; sampling regional cuisine and wines; or trying your hand at something more active, like horse-riding or kayaking.

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EXTENSIONS

No need to miss out. If there's somewhere you particularly want to go that isn't included in your journey itinerary, don't worry. We can add on an extension to take you there before or after the group trip.

WILDLIFE

With much of Latin America still in its natural state, the prolific wildlife is left to roam undisturbed. Times are changing: the modern world and expanded areas of cultivation are definitely making an impact, but you can still find places, surprisingly accessible, where you can observe this flora and fauna close up, from your base at a jungle lodge or on a cruise.

The Amazon of Peru, Ecuador, Brazil and Colombia

The Amazon rainforest is a vast, often impenetrable tropical wilderness, home to thousands of species of flora and fauna. A visit really makes your journey in Peru, Ecuador, Brazil or Colombia complete. Excellent jungle lodges are accessible via a short flight or a longer journey by road and by boat. All offer full board and a programme of activities and excursions into the rainforest led by naturalist guides. You can also take a river cruise.

Peru

Only an hour's flight from Cusco, the river-port of Puerto Maldonado gives access to a number of jungle lodges with excellent wildlife spotting opportunities. There are also lodges in the region around Iquitos (a two-hour flight from Lima), a port from which cruises depart through the jungle.

Ecuador

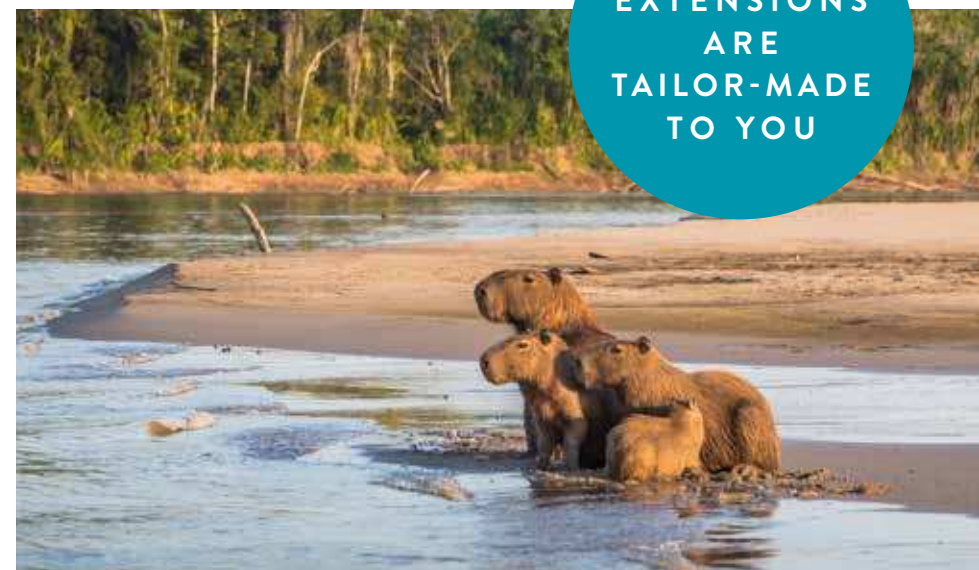
Amazonía can be easily and quickly accessed from Quito by air, or road and river transport. Lodges here are surprisingly comfortable given their isolation and many are run by the local community.

Brazil

Manaus, a direct flight from Rio or São Paulo, is the gateway to the Brazilian jungle. There's a range of accommodation, from rustic lodges to more upmarket properties; and cruises from four to eight days in length.

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Wildlife wilderness in the Pantanal

The vast Brazilian Pantanal wetlands boast an extraordinary abundance of birds and wildlife. This protected wilderness is, according to season, home to flocks of parakeets, macaws and giant storks. In the dry season (Apr-Nov) caiman laze on riverbanks. You may also spot capybaras, armadillos, anteaters and howler monkeys. This huge concentration of birds, reptiles and mammals co-exist with the cattle in this marshy grassland and, because of the sparse vegetation, are easy to spot.

There are a number of eco-friendly, low-key, comfortable lodges, accessible from either Campo Grande or Cuiabá. Each offers activities including wildlife observation by boat safari, on horseback or on foot, on a full-board basis, with most people staying three nights.

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Galápagos Islands

A short flight off the coast of mainland Ecuador, astride the equator in the Pacific Ocean, lie the Galápagos Islands. These peaks of gigantic volcanoes have never been attached to the continent, and over the millennia birds, reptiles and plants have come to adapt to their unique environment. It's one of the greatest wildlife shows on earth, home to dragon-like iguanas, sea-lions, flamingos, crimson-breasted frigate birds, blue-footed boobies; and a rich variety of landscape, from lava scorched rocks, to rich woodland and white-sand beaches.


The archipelago is usually appreciated by cruising around the islands. Vessels, from small motor cruisers to luxurious expedition cruisers, operate varying itineraries from three to eight days long. If you prefer not to sail, there are a number of excellent land-based options. Details of accommodation, cruises and itineraries can be found on our website, or speak to one of our Travel Experts.

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NATURAL & CULTURAL LANDSCAPES

You'll see many of the countries' natural and cultural highlights as you pass through them on your group journeys, but it's not possible to include everything.

Some extensions are obvious and logical – for example, a visit to Easter Island is a popular choice for those visiting Chile. Others are rather less well known, or more specialised, including estancia stays (wine, gastronomy, horse riding) in Argentina. You may add on just a couple of days to see the Maya ruins at Tikal or the Nazca Lines in Peru; or a week or more to cruise to the 'White Continent' Antarctica.

Antarctica

A century after the first expeditions, the most popular form of access to this vast continent is still by sea. However in the last few years some commercial flights have started operating to this distant land. Cruises* navigate their way between yawning ice fields, and mountains of staggering beauty, across waters that reflect the changing moods of the southern sky.

Huge colonies of penguins, and sea lions, albatrosses and other seabirds lay on a spectacular display.

Some of our journeys have Ushuaia, the gateway to the 'White Continent' or Punta Arenas on the Chilean side of the

border, as a port of call. You may leave the group here to join a cruise, or travel south by air at the end of your journey. There is a wide selection of ships from small expeditionary vessels to larger cruise ships with comprehensive facilities.

Fitz Roy, Argentina

If your journey itinerary nears its end in El Calafate, you can choose to extend your time in Argentinian Patagonia before you travel north to Buenos Aires. Take a bus from El Calafate (3-4 hours) to the small mountain resort of El Chaltén. There are splendid scenic walks in the rugged countryside at the foot of the towering slabs of rock and icy pinnacles forming the Fitz Roy massif. The panoramic views of the lakes in this region are truly awe-inspiring. Round off your holiday with two nights in the elegant capital, Buenos Aires.

The Fjords of Chile and Argentina

Patagonia, a wilderness of windswept steppes, jagged mountains and glaciers, is a landscape which feels truly remote. Nowadays, however, it can be visited in comfort: there are first class estancias in stunning countryside, state-of-the-art hotels, and luxurious motor-vessels that offer cruises* exploring the unspoilt secrets of the ice.

The fjords of southern Chile configure a fairy tale land of deep, forested valleys, hanging glaciers and tiny maritime settlements. Further south, cruises explore the Beagle Channel and Tierra del Fuego, and even take you to rugged Cape Horn.

Connects with journeys that pass through Ushuaia, Puerto Natales and Punta Arenas.

*Cruises last 4-7 days.

The Glaciers of Argentinian Patagonia

Cross the border from Chilean Patagonia to the Argentinian side of the jagged, ice-capped Andes range and stay in El Calafate, a little resort town on wilderness plains close to the edge of the milky, turquoise waters of Lago Argentino. From here, visit the towering ice walls of the Perito Moreno glacier and the traditional ranch at Estancia Cristina. Both tourist and first-class options are available. Round off your holiday with a couple of days in Argentina's elegant capital, Buenos Aires.

Connects with journeys nearing the end in Torres del Paine.



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Ushuaia, Tierra del Fuego

For those whose group itinerary nears its end in Patagonia, an extension can be added to Ushuaia (a short flight from El Calafate). This, the world's most southerly city, and a busy port at the tip of the Andes range, is your base for explorations to the bays, lakes, rivers and peaks of the Tierra del Fuego National Park. Cruise down the Beagle Channel spotting penguins, and pay a visit to the historic Harberton Ranch, before flying north for a final night in Argentina's cosmopolitan capital, Buenos Aires.

Connects with journeys nearing the end in El Calafate.



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Iguazú Falls

Perhaps the most stunning sight in Latin America is the Iguazú Falls: a 2.7km chain of 275 cataracts tumble and roar over a 60m precipice in a protected, sub-tropical rainforest that is alive with birds and butterflies. The cataracts straddle the border between Argentina and Brazil, and on either side there is a range of accommodation, from spacious tourist-class hotels to first-class traditional or contemporary establishments, many of which are set in extensive grounds with outside pools. Two nights in Iguazú is normally sufficient to see both sides of the falls, before flying home via São Paulo or continuing for a few days in Rio de Janeiro.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Buenos Aires or Rio.

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Atacama Desert, Chile

The Atacama Desert, where it approaches the Bolivian border, is a high-altitude landscape of volcanoes, salt lakes and supreme, rugged beauty. The Moon Valley, the geysers at El Tatio, and pretty mountain villages such as Toconao are among a host of attractions here. Stay in comfortable accommodation in San Pedro, an adobe town that is the hub for visits to the region, or at a more luxurious hotel, where excursions and excellent meals are included.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Santiago.

Copper Canyon, Mexico

The Copper Canyon has some of the continent's most awe-inspiring mountain scenery, with scores of epic gorges and ravines, some of which are deeper than the Grand Canyon. A spectacular rail journey begins in Chihuahua and climbs into the Sierra Madre, where a night is spent on the canyon rim. The descent crosses bridges, passes through tunnels and around sweeping bends to arrive at Los Mochis. Access is from Chihuahua in the north of Mexico.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Mexico City.

Peru's Nazca Lines

No one knows for sure why an ancient, unknown civilisation etched huge geometric markings – the Nazca Lines, Peru – into the desert south of Lima. Their scale and complexity can be best appreciated from the air. You can combine your extension with a visit to the wildlife-rich Ballestas Islands just off the coast from Paracas.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Lima.



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Easter Island

Polynesian Easter Island lies 2,200 miles off the coast of Chile. This tiny territory, triangular in shape and with a volcano in each corner, has only 5,000 inhabitants, and is famed for its vast, brooding stone statues or *moai*. The balmy climate and the genuine warmth of the inhabitants make this unspoilt destination one of our most popular. Our featured extensions include a three- or four-night stay at a secluded hotel, but there are a number of properties to choose from as well as shorter or longer stays.

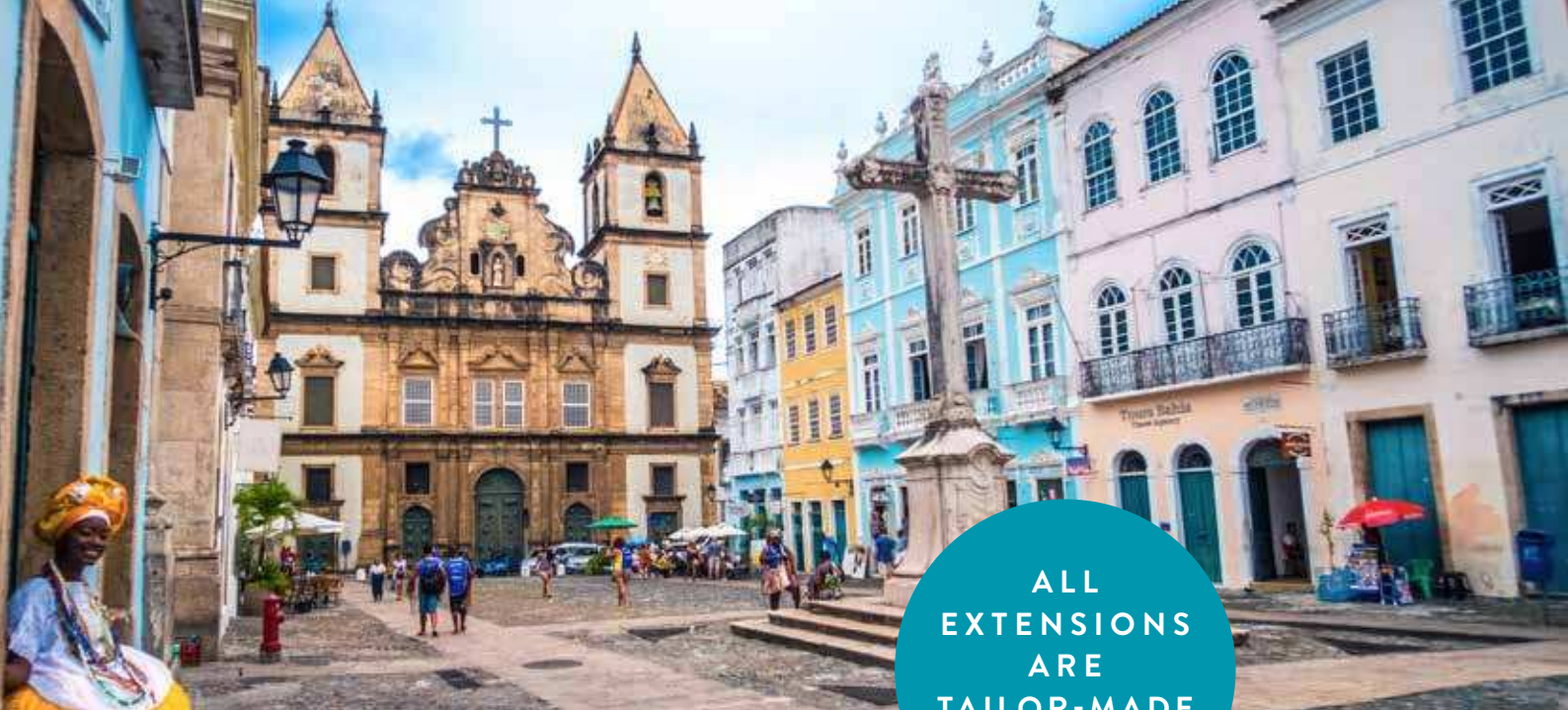

Salvador da Bahia

The coastal city of Salvador is an unmissable highlight of Brazil, and integral to an understanding of the country. Here, the African influence is dominant, with food, dance and religious ritual all harking back to the mother continent, and there is some of the most beautifully restored colonial architecture in the country. It's a joyous place, alive with music and colour, and with some stunning beaches nearby.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Rio.

Tikal

If your holiday in Central America doesn't include a trip to the ruins, it is easy to add on a visit to what many regard as the most awe-inspiring archaeological sites on the continent. From Antigua, it is a short drive to Guatemala City, for the hour-long flight to Flores. Accommodation is in a jungle lodge in the heart of the tropical national park, or the island town of Flores, your base for a two-day visit to the ruins. There is a guided tour of the temples and pyramids, from which you can look out over a jungle canopy full of monkeys and parrots. Fly back to Guatemala City for a final night.

Lake Atitlán

Guatemala is a deeply traditional country, where indigenous and colonial cultures and rituals have blended and developed over the centuries, remaining a unique feature of contemporary life. It's also blessed with gorgeous scenery, dominated by around 35 volcanoes. Lake Atitlán is a mystical body of water surrounded by volcanic cones and tiny farmsteads. Visit some of the small towns along the shore, where traditional dress is still worn.

Connects with tours starting/ending in Guatemala.

Estancia stays

In colonial times, large tracts of land in Latin America were divided into estates – estancias or haciendas, which had elegant, palatial residences. Some have been refurbished and opened up to visitors, a few have been converted into luxury hotels, and a number are still operating ranches or wineries. They offer visitors a warm family-style welcome, excellent facilities and a range of activities from wine-tasting and bird-watching to nature trails and horse riding. One of our favourites is La Bamba in Argentina, but you can also spend several days unwinding in estancias in Chile, Mexico or Ecuador.



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BEACH WIND DOWNS

Few of our itineraries offer you much opportunity to lounge on the beach. However, a few days on the coast is a great way to round off a busy, invigorating holiday. Most itineraries begin or end within reasonable reach of a sandy beach or rocky cove with excellent hotel facilities.



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The Mayan Riviera

The beaches of Mexico are some of the best on the continent, from the white powder sands of the Caribbean coast to the rocky coves and rolling surf of the Pacific, and there are some excellent hotels from which to enjoy them.

There are many properties on the Mayan Riviera, spread along the coast, where creamy beaches meet tropical forests. All of which are convenient if ending your journey in Cancun. There are also several attractive, mid-range hotels close to the resort of Playa del Carmen, and the iconic cliff edge ruins of Tulum.

Connects with journeys ending in Cancun or any end destination with flights to Mexico.

Ambergris Caye

Fly to the coral island of Ambergris Caye off the coast of Belize, and spend a few days at the first-class plantation style Victoria House. Alternatively, pick one of the other stunning properties or cayes that stretch the length of the Caribbean coast.

Connects with journeys ending in Belize.



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Uruguay

This tiny, friendly country on the eastern shore of the River Plate, maintains a character of its own. Renowned for its beef-rearing grasslands, it also boasts glamorous golden beaches and plush hotels, perfect for a wind down after any group tour.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Buenos Aires.



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The Beaches of Cuba

Cuban beaches boast the Caribbean's famous translucent turquoise seas with pristine sand and unspoilt landscapes. There are a number of resorts around the island, which vary in terms of facilities and accessibility. Some, such as Varadero, are busy strips with a number of hotels, restaurants, bars and clubs; others are situated on remote islands (cayos), including Cayo Las Brujas and Cayo Levisa, with pearl white beaches and good snorkelling.

Ilha Grande

Down the 'green coast' from Rio lies Ilha Grande, a beautiful, forested island where tourism is kept low-key and informal. Trails lead across the lush, undulating interior and there are stunning beaches hidden among rocky coves. Accommodation ranges from hippyish to boutique, and the atmosphere is laid-back and completely relaxing.

Connects with journeys starting/ending in Rio.

Búzios

Just up the road from Rio de Janeiro lies the Armação de Búzios peninsula; a sophisticated, informal resort scattered around a series of alluring bays. Cobble streets and small, low-rise pousadas give it a Mediterranean feel; its many stylish open-air bars, restaurants, boutiques and galleries are frequented by well-to-do Brazilians as well as foreign tourists. Outside the busy high season (Dec-Feb), the tranquillity and natural beauty make for a relaxing stay.

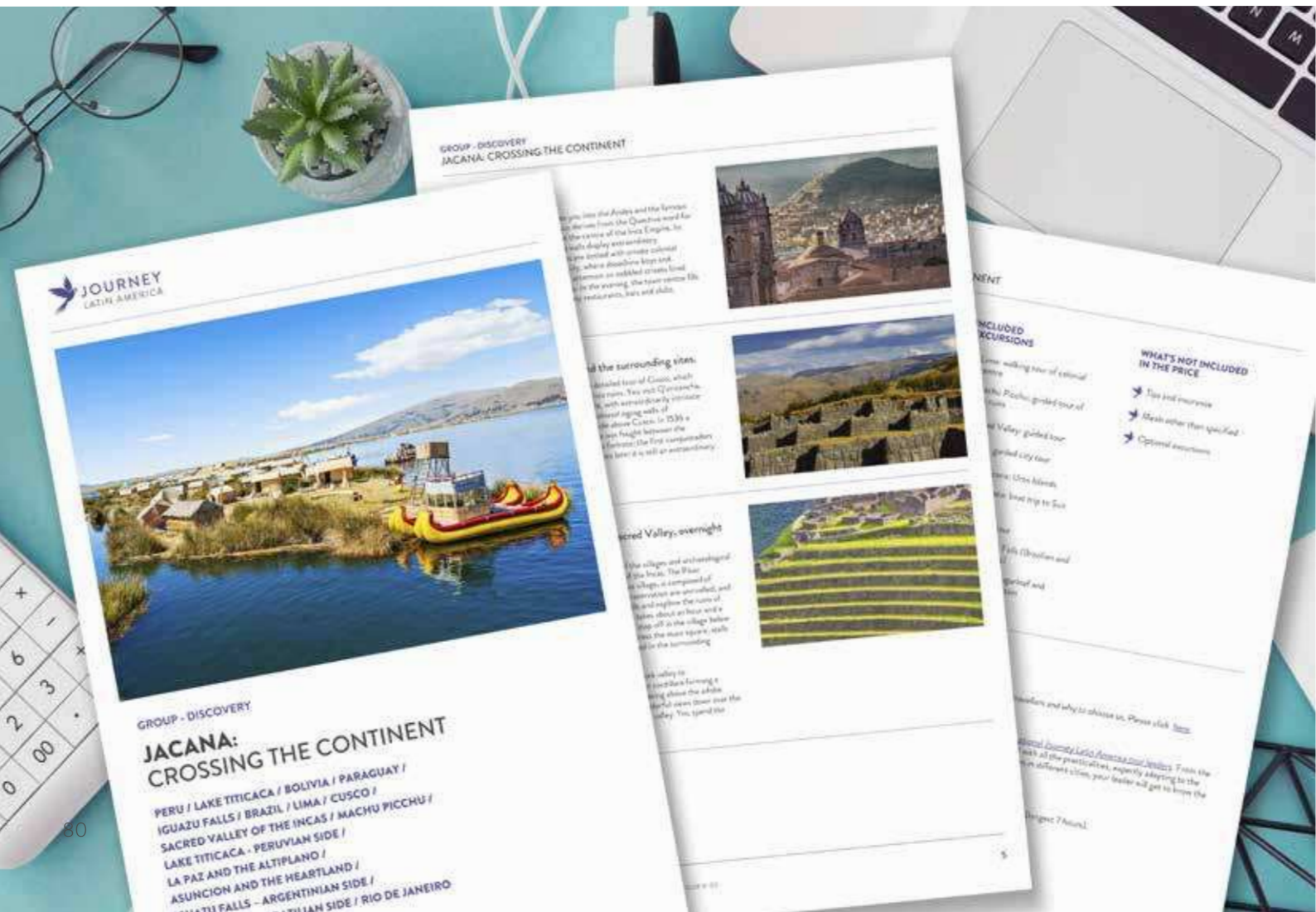
