DAYS 1-4

Stroll along the cobbles of Old Havana, music seeps out of every doorway and the narrow pastel-hued streets are clogged with bikes. Turn west to eco-friendly Las Terrazas and the Viñales valley, where farmers sit relaxing under shady trees smoking cigars.

DAYS 5-12

Eastwards, the crumbly cities each have a story to tell. Wander the elegant French boulevards of Cienfuegos; in colonial Trinidad dancing and music continues into the early hours, while Camaguey is renowned for poetry and ballet and Santiago is a melting pot of Haitian and African motifs.

DAYS 13-18

Drive east to the island's tip, call in at lazy Baracoa, and Gibara, a pretty port set among sugar fields on the craggy northeast coast, before departing from Holguin or add an extension, spending time in sun-kissed Guardalavaca.

MEXICO



Mexico's vast size promises stunning natural and cultural diversity. On display are the traces of the Aztec and Mayan empires, with magnificently sculpted pyramids and temples abandoned for centuries to a greedy rainforest. Ornate Spanish colonial towns dot the craggy mountainsides while the inviting white-sand coastline is lapped by azure seas.

- **Mexico City** The energetic capital is glamorous, extravagant, modest and always mesmerising with Aztec pyramids, an ornate Spanish cathedral and world-class museums.
- 2 Chiapas Bohemian San Cristóbal de las Casas is a magnet for lovers of little bars and live music, while the surrounding rebellious Mayan villages give an insight into an age-old indian lifestyle.
- Baja California This peninsula of rugged, scorched desert is fringed by chalk-white beaches and aquamarine seas bursting with dazzling marine life.

DAYS 4-7

DAYS 8-14

Guatemala highlights

Picturesque Guatemala lies at the heart of the Mayan world. Frequent exotic, colour-soaked festivals intertwine Christian motifs with the mysticism of old beliefs, and proud villagers lead an unchanging traditional lifestyle on pocket-sized farmsteads. Highland markets selling everything from incense to wooden masks are a kaleidoscope of colour, while gentle marimba music fills the colonial courtyards.

- **1** Tikal Lofty pyramids punch through the jungle canopy in the vast, long-abandoned Mayan city.
- 2 Caribbean coast Steamy tropical lowlands, overlooked by a vast Spanish fort, pulsate to an Afro-Caribbean beat.
- **B** Lanquín Base for exploring coffee plantations, limestone caves and the cascading turquoise pools surrounded by lush jungle at Semuc Champey.
- 4 Antigua A colonial gem dotted with shady plazas and courtyards bursting with bougainvillea, surrounded by smoking volcanoes.
- 5 Atitlán The deep blue waters of Lake Atitlán are circled by towering volcanoes and its shoreline is pitted with ancient Mayan villages.
- 6 Western highlands A wild, isolated region pervaded by ancestral customs such as a drink-fuelled, day-long horse-race.



Signature Guatemala: Mountain markets and Mayan ruins 12 days from £2,500pp

- DAYS 1-3 Wander the arty cobbled lanes of Antigua. The ruined churches, convents and monasteries attest the power of the volcanoes brooding over the city. Browse the boutiques and galleries, and drop in to one of the cosy cafés.
- DAYS 4-8 Atmospheric Lake Atitlán is fringed by kitchen gardens and emerald volcanoes casting shadows on the silvery waters. Take a boat trip to lakeside Santiago, an excellent place to buy authentic textiles. Continue into the mountains to the indigenous markets of the highlands; the lifeblood of remote communities. A living tableau of rural life, their stalls are heaving with produce traded by farmers congregating to swap village gossip.
- DAYS 9-12 Explore the vast complex of temples at Mayan Tikal, its pyramids shrouded in monkey-filled rainforest. The views from one of these ancient skyscrapers are unforgettable.

WHAT WE LOVE

I stopped at Yaxha, an isolated and largely unexcavated Mayan site, enabling me to quietly enjoy the wildlife. Climbing the tallest temple, I was stunned by the views of the jungle and lagoon.

Browse an open-air market

Streets come alive with commerce when Chichicastenango hosts Guatemala's largest open-air market. Stalls are piled high with rainbowhued textiles, pottery, leather belts and flowers in a medley of mystical Mayan and Catholic influences.



Belize highlights

Awaiting exploration in this English-speaking corner of Central America are jungle rivers, mysterious caves, and birdfilled trails. Wildlife is rife throughout, with watchful jaguars inhabiting the forest. There are numerous jungle-caressed Mayan archaeological sites, now the home of iguanas and monkeys.

- **1** Caribbean Coast Turquoise seas lap idyllic beaches, with coral reefs and wrecks harbouring a wealth of underwater life. The astonishing Blue Hole is a world-class dive site.
- 2 Mountains and jungle The unspoilt interior has intricate, little-visited Mayan ceremonial sites; Wildlife sanctuaries sit beside sugar cane fields; leafy Mountain Pine Ridge offers active eco-adventures.
- **3** Toledo and the south Dense rainforest canopies conceal caves and creeks, clear natural pools and waterfalls. On the coast the fishing port Punta Gorda is the launch pad for explorations.



Signature Belize: Rainforest, reef and ruins 12 days from £3,975pp

- DAYS 1-5 Head for the emerald hills of the interior, enveloped by tropical foliage. Visit the spooky ATM Mayan ceremonial caves, and consider a trip over the border to Tikal in Guatemala, where monkeys scurry around the towering pyramids of the abandoned city. Back in Belize, at Lamanai you can spot toucans at dawn, and enjoy sunset cocktails on the river.
- DAYS 6-8 Belize is famous for its eco-tourism and you'll stay at a lodge in the less-visited south where you can go kayaking, snorkelling, caving, and hiking. To meet local people, visit a welcoming Mayan or Garifuna community.
- DAYS 9-12 The wooden houses of Caribbean village Placencia are built on stilts among swaying palms rooted in powderwhite sands. Indulge in a variety of water sports or go on a boat trip to seek out the elephantine West-Indian manatee.

Explore subterranean caves Hike into the shadowy caverns, cross underground rivers and enter a giant chamber. Once the setting for Mayan religious ceremonies, it's stuffed with relics including ceramics and, gruesomely, skeletons.

The mind-boggling plethora of birds sheltering in the fertile greenery of Belize's pristine landscapes attracts bird lovers from all over the world. 605 species are on view, from tiny hummingbirds to majestic eagles.

Belize really moves to its own beat - the coast is unmistakably Caribbean with incredible white sand beaches, turquoise seas and coral reefs, laidback people, pulsating reggae and rum punch. Combined with Mayan ruins and a plethora of wildlife and you have the recipe for a perfect holiday.



Island glamping and snorkelling

Many of Belize's attractions are waterfocussed, unsurprising given the huge coral reef offshore. Snorkel, dive or kayak in the clear aquamarine waters in the company of whale-sharks or rays.



El Salvador highlights

It's a tiny country of wild beauty with a bucolic rhythm and among the most welcoming people in Latin America. That's why, for some of us, it is our favourite. The gorgeous floral Ruta de las Flores splices a coffee-growing heartland and is home to peaceful colonial towns and cobbled lanes.



- 1 Suchitoto This exquisite, flowerladen centre for arts and culture hosts internationally-renowned fiestas.
- 2 Parque El Imposible This coastal range, the haunt of puma and eagles, has delightful walking trails.
- **3** San Salvador The busy historic capital tells a tale of upheaval alongside artistic renovation.
- 4 Perquin Once a hotbed of revolution it's now a peaceful town with an evocative war museum.
- 6 El Sunzal A sweep of volcanic sand is thumped by Pacific waves beloved of surfers.
- 6 Gulf of Fonseca Whales and dolphins play in this mangrovefringed waterway peppered with picturesque islands.

Signature El Salvador: Revolutionary road trip 11 days from £2,510pp

- DAYS 1-3 Peer into the crater of extinct El Boquerón volcano. Explore the fine pyramids of Mayan ceremonial centre El Tazumal, set among coffee and sugar cane plantations. Linger in a coffee shop at Ataco, a renovated cobbled town on the Ruta del las Flores, a road which isn't just scenically beautiful - dip into a cultural heaven of museums, crafts, floral displays and food fairs.
- DAYS 4-8 By kayak or bike, discover Jiquilisco Bay's creeks and mangroves a haven for birds and turtles. Sip from a coconut as the sun sets over a serene watery land. Boat over the Gulf de Fonseca and continue to Perquín to learn about the now resolved civil war, and visit Joya de Cerén, the Pompeii of the Americas.
- DAYS 9-11 Delight in the arty workshops of Suchitoto, the country's colonial gem. Return for a visit of San Salvador's historic centre.

Views of three volcanoes appear through gaps in the foliage: trek through the clouds to enjoy heady views from the summit of Santa Ana, the highest of the coastal range.

HONDURAS

Honduras highlights

Macaw

Considered by many as the ultimate banana republic, Honduras also has beautiful national parks protecting flowering, bird-rich rainforest, deep river canyons and waterfalls. Discover prolific marine life in the Bay Islands off the mainland's palm-whispered Caribbean coast, and explore ruined Mayan cities in the heart of the jungle.



- 1 Copán The craftsmanship of the lavishly sculptured Mayan ruins here has survived the assaults of time and the tentacles of a rapacious jungle.
- Roatán An idyllic Caribbean island 2 fringed by white beaches and lapped by warm, glass-clear waters, with coral reefs teeming with marine life.
- 3 Pico Bonito This tropical national park, criss-crossed by walking trails shelters rainforest, creeks and canyons cut through by sparkling rivers and waterfalls.

Signature Honduras: Jungle, Islands and Mayan Ruins 11 days from £2,640pp

- DAYS 1-4 Travel through coffee and tobacco plantations to Copán ruins, a quaint colonial town hosting some of the most elaborately embellished pre-Columbian ruins in the Americas. The intricate carvings narrate the battles fought, and the fate of the enemy. In the jungle nearby you'll be dazzled by the bright flash of a macaw's wings.
- DAYS 5-7 Inland from the coast, at Pico Bonito National Park, hundreds of tropical bird species are protected. From your eco-lodge you can explore sun-dappled trails at dawn or dusk with a soundtrack of birdsong, or go white-water rafting on a wild river.
- DAYS 8-11 By boat to Caribbean Roatán island, where worldrenowned dive and snorkelling sites dot the surrounding azure waters. Spy out the hammerhead sharks, rays, turtles and tiny seahorses which frequent the coral reef. You can kick back on powdery sands, and enjoy the laid-back Afro-Caribbean culture of lobster and calypso.

WHAT WE LOVE

The day I discovered the beauty of our oceans is the day when I entered the blue waters in Roatán. There I learned to dive and discover how fascinating the coral reef really is. Lina Fuller



Live a timeless idyll

In the rugged, warmly forested hills around Pico Bonito, isolated rural communities lead a slow-paced way of life – watch horse-and-carts ply the gravel roads, and tiny farmsteads where families are oblivious to the goings-on of the outside world.

All along the sultry Caribbean coast you can discover divine palm-fringed beaches, and meet small communities of Garifuna (descendants of African slaves and indigenous tribes) along with a swashbuckling history of piracy.



Nicaragua highlights

The fuming volcanoes mirror the political upheavals which have kept Nicaragua a little known destination. But that's what makes it so alluring - the lyrical, unchanging rural lifestyle of the coffee hills; the primitive art of Lake Nicaragua's rebellious Solentiname islands; the most bird-prolific nature reserves in Central America.

- **Granada** Explore the romantic and beautifullyrestored lakeside colonial city, by horse-drawn carriage.
- 2 **Ometepe Island** A scenic laid-back island formed of twin volcanic peaks that rise from the vast metallic-blue waters of Lake Nicaragua.
- Bio San Juan The wildliferich jungle borders this river which flows from Lake Nicaragua to the Caribbean Sea.
- 4 Leon Crumbly churches and walls adorned with revolutionary murals, offset by the city's lively nightlife.
- 6 Pacific Coast San Juan del Sur is a surfers' paradise, where turtles nest undisturbed on golden sands.
- 6 Corn Islands The mellow, English-speaking Afro-Caribbean islands offer a relaxed, homely beach scene and fresh lobster.



Signature Nicaragua: Fire, Water and Revolution 13 days from £2,700pp

- DAYS 1-3 You'll travel by road and river to El Castillo, a remote and quirky waterside village dwarfed by the huge Spanish hilltop fort once captured by Nelson. Go caiman-spotting in the surrounding rainforest.
- DAYS 4-7 Explore the magical region: stroll past the aristocratic mansions in Spanish Granada, and pause to people watch at the city's social hub, Parque Central. Take a small boat and snake between watery islets, before a ferry-ride to the remote Ometepe Island. Listen to howler monkeys; discover pre-Columbian petroglyphs and relish the peaceful rural lifestyle that has changed very little for centuries.
- DAYS 8-10 Stay in the lively beach town of San Juan del Sur and discover unspoilt and secluded beaches on the Pacific Coast. Turtles hatch on the beaches just south of town between September and April - a spectacular sight.
- DAYS 11-13 Rebellious but stately Leon's colonial churches are in abundance. Climb a bell tower for a rooftop view or join the artists, poets and students for drinks in the boisterous bar scene.

WHAT WE LOVE

For me, a bird-lover, the Refugio de Vida Silvestre Los Guatuzos was heaven. The butterfly farm, caiman and turtle refuges, trails and canopy walkways were a delight. On the boat ride we identified over 40 out of the 389 bird species thriving there.

Costa Rica is a treasure trove for nature-lovers and an adventurer's playground. Known for their professionally-run national parks, they proudly protect their precious landscapes of volcanoes, mountain cloud forests, rainforests, savannahs and wild jungle-fringed beaches, all of which are teeming with bird and animal-life. Plantations of its world-famous coffee blanket the sunny slopes while trees laden with orchids are home to quetzals, trogons and hummingbirds.

Costa Ricans are open and charismatic, with a cheerful Latin personality - meaning you are sure to make new friends here.



Costa Rica highlights

- **1** San José In the modern capital there are good museums, parks and restaurants. Smouldering volcanoes are close by.
- 2 Monteverde cloud forest Hummingbirds and exotic tree frogs thrive among mossy trees and misty ferns, fluttering over colour-splashed orchids.
- 3 Arenal volcano region Surrounded by lakes, rivers and waterfalls, it's popular among adventure enthusiasts, with ziplining and water-rafting.
- 5







Osa Peninsula Prolific wildlife in shallow lagoons, mangrove swamps, rivers, rainforest and untouched stretches of pristine beaches.

6 Caribbean and Tortuguero

The Afro-Caribbean southern beaches are folksy and laid-back. Tortuguero National Park is a sanctuary for nesting turtles.

Signature Costa Rica: The Natural Highlights 15 days from £4,960pp

DAYS 1-4

From the bustling capital of San José, head to the Caribbean Coast and explore the sinuous creeks of Tortuguero National Park. An astounding variety of wildlife shelters here including nesting turtles, monkeys, and three-toed sloths.

DAYS 5-7

Bathe in naturally heated thermal springs in the shadow of the picture-perfect Arenal Volcano, and cruise through wetlands sheltering thousands of migrating birds.

DAYS 8-10

Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve lies over rolling hills cloaked in mist-soaked tropical foliage where you can spot many tropical birds - with luck, the bright iridescent red and green plumage of the country's iconic quetzal.

DAYS 11-15

Plunge into a vibrant natural world at Corcovado National Park on the Osa Peninsula's wild Pacific Coast. Look out for scarlet macaws, howler monkeys and toucans while on guided walks, or take a boat trip and spot dolphins and humpback whales.

Canopy adventures

In a conservation-friendly country well set up for active adventures, choose between flitting over the canopy on a zipline eye-to-eye with tree-top wildlife or swaying over a bubbling creek on a hanging bridge.

River raft to your hotel

Pass waterfalls cascading into the river from steep rock faces above while spotting birds flying overhead - before a rushing sound preludes the rapids ahead, as you approach your riverside lodge.



See nesting turtles

Whether you watch giant female turtles crowding the beach to lay their eggs or palm-sized babies emerging and courageously dashing into the sea it's an extraordinary moment.

Kayak through the mangroves

Glide over silent waters among the spindly, grasping roots of twisted mangroves and spot white-faced monkeys, anteaters, sloths, tree iguanas and caiman, whilst colourful tropical birds fly overhead.





Quetzal spotting

Shady, dripping cloud forest is the habitat of the resplendent quetzal, whose brightly coloured plumage will leave you in awe. Worshipped by Aztecs and Mayans, it's justifiably the country's best-loved bird.

Soak in volcanic hot springs

In a natural river gorge, free-flowing pools connected by rippling waterfalls are encircled by overhanging trees, vines and ferns: an idyllic setting for a dip in undisturbed tranquillity.

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Panama highlights

Panama, the bridge between the Americas, is home to the vast Panama Canal which links the oceans. You can visit some of nature's richest forests which teem with wildlife and luscious plants. The capital city is one of the world's most cosmopolitan, while the pearl-white beaches remain undeveloped.

There are plenty of remnants of a wild history of piracy: colonial forts, shipwrecks, cannons and towering city walls tell a colourful story.



- 0 San Blas This archipelago of 400 white-sand coral islands is home to the autonomous Guna Yala indians.
- 2 Panama Canal A colossal project with its formidable locks and museum is a must-see for all visitors.
- 3 Panama City Casco Viejo's coloursplashed Spanish colonial streets are alive with cocktail bars and live music.
- 4 The Pacific coast The beachfringed Azuero Peninsula is dotted with sleepy country towns and cattle ranches.
- 5 Boquete Rugged mist-shrouded volcanoes, cloud forest and boulderstrewn rivers create a dramatic landscape.
- 6 Bocas del Toro Isolated, pristine Afro-Caribbean islands of mangroves and coral reefs burst with marine life.

Signature Panama: Canal, Wildlife and Beach 10 days from £2,515pp

- DAYS 1-3 Explore Panama City, where soaring skyscrapers are the backdrop to forts, Spanish convents and sumptuous French-style mansions, reminders of its colonial heyday. The bubbly population loves a fiesta, pavement cafés are heaving, the harbour-side fish market buzzing. Then it's all aboard to rise and fall through the locks of the jungle-fringed Panama Canal.
- DAYS 4-5 The cloud forests in the Chiriquí highlands have a different feel. Go quetzal-spotting, stroll through verdant coffee plantations, dip into an active adventure by zip-line or hanging bridge.
- DAYS 6-10 With rocky outcrops and reefs ideal for snorkelling and diving, Bocas del Toro is a marvellously laid-back hang-out. The islands shelter profuse wildlife - tropical birds, frogs and butterflies - and are blessed with golden sunsets. Spot more rainforest creatures back at Soberania National Park close to the capital.

WHAT WE LOVE

Hiking the Ruta de los Quetzales through the Parque Nacional Volcan-Barú, home to 280 species of bird and six different microclimates, was definitely worth the effort to appreciate the magnificent views of the volcano.



Highlights

These outposts of British, French and Dutch colonisation have a medley of personalities you can revel in - Caribbean, Amerindian, even Chinese. All have untouched Amazonian rainforest and savannah hinterlands with rivers sheltering giant otters and bird-flecked waterfalls.

- **1** Kaieteur Falls A massive drop of foaming water five times higher than Niagara thundering through tropical rainforest.
- 2 Iwokrama rainforest This huge area of rainforest is a haven for wildlife including tapirs, harpy eagles, reptiles, exotic birds, monkeys and jaguars.
- **3** Rupununi savannah Bird-rich prairies inhabited by anteaters and storks are cut through by rivers teeming with caiman and otters.
- **4** Paramaribo Suriname's capital is a cultural mélange with mosques, churches and synagogues and is renowned for its ornate wooden Dutch colonial buildings.
- 5 Kourou The French space centre on the Caribbean coast launches several rockets per year.



Discovering the hidden Guianas 15 days from £7,725pp

- DAYS 1-5 Explore Suriname's capital Paramaribo, soaking up a small-town atmosphere with its vibrant fusion of Dutch/indigenous/African architecture and street life. Head inland by canoe to jungle-fringed Danpaati river and visit a village inhabited by Maroons; descendants of African slaves.
- DAYS 6-8 Visit the space station's mammoth facility in French Guiana then move on to discover Devil's Island, which hosted the notorious penal colony; wander the cells reclaimed by voracious vegetation.
- DAYS 9-15 In Guyana, atmospheric Georgetown is filled with Caribbean architecture. Head into the wild interior of jungle-clad hills and grasslands: flying over giant Kaieteur Falls is a real thrill, while in Iwokrama you'll view the rainforest canopy wildlife from a high-level walkway with the howler monkeys. Climb Surama mountain to spot birdlife, and seek out curious otters on Buro-Buro River.

Dive into joyous Rio de Janeiro, where glamorous apartments fringe the glossy beaches, a lively colonial centre hosts baroque churches and street art, and Sugar Loaf Mountain overlooks a boat-speckled cobalt bay. Survey it all from the cable car, and from the Christ statue atop Corcovado. On a golden evening, sip a caipirinha and relax to the rhythm of a sultry bossa nova.

DAYS 4-8

Atacama Desert

CHILE

Chile is proud of its arts and culture: its worldfamous poets and authors, its lyrical wineries. But it's the mesmerising scenery which will stagger you most: wildlife-filled countryside from scorched volcano-dotted desert through a forested land of lakes to a Patagonian wilderness spliced by enormous glaciers.

The great cities of Santiago and Valparaiso offer a history narrated in vivid street art along with fine-dining: but it's mostly a country of the great outdoors, with a range of activities to match.





Chile highlights

- **1** Santiago area The capital's busy colonial centre is offset by skyscrapers and leafy boulevards. Nearby is the bohemian Pacific port of Valparaíso.
- 2 Central valley The fertile region of sunny slopes is dotted with prestigious wineries, many offering charming rural accommodation.
- **3** Lake district Royal blue lakes surrounded by snow-throttled volcanoes, crystal clear rivers and ancient monkey puzzle forests.

DAYS 1-4

After exploring Santiago fly to the Atacama Desert where tiny oasis villages are surrounded by volcanoes and geysers steaming and hissing into life, and where pink flamingos dot the dazzling chalk-white salt flats.

DAYS 5-7

Travel south to the gorgeous lake district. Here, pine-whispered parks sit beside the snowy flanks of sky-grazing volcanoes. Explore by bike, on foot, white-water raft or kayak. Chiloé Island beckons with its quaint wooden churches, fishermen's homes on stilts, oysters and lazy-paced rural traditions.

DAYS 8-13

Continue further south to Patagonia's Torres del Paine National Park. Stunning trails will lead you to rivers ridden by icebergs, mint-green lagoons, sapphire lakes, ice-tipped granite spires and grassy plains with huddles of grazing Guanacos. Watch condors soar high above you and, with luck, you may even spot a puma.



Torres del Paine hiking

The Patagonian scenery is humblingly huge: the trek to the French Valley reaches an extraordinary threepronged amphitheatre of vertical glacier-mantled peaks.

Easter Island Moai

Moai (the island's famous carved stone heads), gaze inwards to the grassy landscapes of the faraway island. Discover them sitting on rocky plinths above the sparkling Pacific shores.



Valley of the Moon, Atacama

Explore wind-eroded tunnels and caverns; climb the tallest dune to see the valley at the height of its magic, painted by the fiery tones of the sunset.

Cruise glacial fjords

Sail through southernmost Patagonia's shattered landscape of forested fjords and deserted islets, marvelling at hanging glaciers, colonies of chattering penguins and playful sea lions as you journey all the way to Cape Horn.





Self-drive in Patagonia

Vast frost-bitten landscapes are wonderful to explore in your own car - discover gravel roads winding alongside shadowy forests, passing isolated farmsteads as the icy form of an Andean peak looms into view.

Microbreweries by bike

Artisan beer is all the rage: Cycle along the pretty shores of Lake Llanquihue popping into cute Bavarian-style towns for liquid refreshment.

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ARGENTINA

This is a country which tempts with open-air adventures in lofty deserts and among ice-stifled peaks. The profusion of wildlife is astonishing mammals, reptiles and birds abound in marshes, rainforest, and yawning pampas along the blustery Patagonian coast.

But beyond the infinite skies, shimmering glaciers and horizon-bending pampas, Argentina is the cradle of the tango and a premier producer of fine wines and juicy grass-fed beef. Its capital, Buenos Aires, is one of Latin America's most stylish.


