OVERVIEW & OUTLINE ITINERARY

From the vibrant capital Quito, fly to the Galapagos for a cruise on a small, good value, popular and informal vessel.

DAY 1	Arrive in Quito and transfer to hotel.
DAY 2	Guided city tour of Quito
DAY 3	Fly to the Galápagos Islands and embark for your cruise.
DAYS 4-9	Land excursions from the cruise around the Galápagos Islands.
DAY 10	Fly to the mainland, connect with international flight home.



ITINERARY

It doesn't have to break the bank to spend a whole week's cruise observing the unique fauna of Ecuador's Galápagos Islands. You'll sail on a small motor cruiser offering the informal atmosphere favoured by those who prefer the laid-back approach of smaller craft to the larger luxury vessels. You will have ample opportunity to make new friends among people with shared interests. In addition to landings on the islands you will have the opportunity to snorkel or swim with sealions. Travel by night and awaken next day with a new island to discover.

Spend a day exploring the colonial capital, before heading across the ocean to embark on a cruise to see the greatest wildlife show on Earth. It was on a similar trip over 200 years ago that Darwin returned to the archipelago to write the seminal book 'The Origin of the Species'. Step into his shoes and explore the diversity of land and marine life which inhabit these enchanting islands. You'll have the opportunity to observe a wide range of bird, mammal, reptile and insect species in a hugely contrasting variety of natural habitats, not to mention a plethora of exotic flora. The twisted lava, dense forests and white sand beaches are a great attraction too, as are the snorkelling and swimming experiences.

DAY 1

Arrive in Quito and transfer to hotel.

Arrive in Quito, Ecuador's captivating Andean capital, perched dramatically at 2,850 metres above sea level – making it one of the highest capitals on Earth. The city stretches along a narrow valley beneath the watchful presence of Guagua Pichincha, an active volcano that dominates the skyline. Quito is a city of contrasts: its modern sector gleams with glass-fronted towers, bustling commercial centres, and cosmopolitan restaurants, while the historic heart – a UNESCO World Heritage Site – is a treasure trove of colonial splendour. Here, cobbled streets wind past elegant Spanish-style mansions, ornate churches, and lively plazas filled with open-air markets, offering a glimpse into centuries of tradition amid the rhythm of contemporary life.

DAY 2

Guided city tour of Quito

Enjoy a half day walking tour exploring the colonial treasures of Quito's historic centre. Stroll along narrow cobblestone streets framed by whitewashed façades, while the elegant spires and domes of centuries-old churches rise above. The route takes you through the city's main plaza, home to the Government Palace and the Cathedral, before continuing to some of Quito's most iconic religious landmarks from the 16th and 17th centuries. Highlights include the grand San Francisco Monastery and the striking Basilica del Voto Nacional, renowned for its unusual gargoyles inspired by Ecuador's native wildlife.



DAY 3

Fly to the Galápagos Islands and embark for your cruise.

Transfer to the airport for your flight to the Galápagos Islands. Embark on your explorer for your 8 day cruise around the archipelago.

DAYS 4-9

Land excursions from the cruise around the Galápagos Islands.

The Galápagos Islands emerged in the Pacific Ocean six million years ago following a spate of volcanic activity and, isolated from the continental mainland, have become home to unique animal and plant species.

The islands were the inspiration for Charles Darwin's theory of evolution, which formed the basis for his revolutionary book 'The Origin of the Species', published in 1859. Without fear of humans, they are sufficiently trusting to allow you to approach them and observe them up close.

Although geologically constantly on the move, these islands remain suspended in time, with giant tortoises, iguanas, penguins, frigate birds, waved albatross and blue-footed boobies and a wealth of rare flora all thriving there. For many, the fascinating and unique wildlife and natural beauty of the islands are matched by the thrill of being at sea. Find a spot on deck as you make your way through the ocean, often trailed by flocks of birds and playful dolphins.

The itinerary for your days in the Galápagos will depend on your date of departure and is subject to change. There are normally two landings a day to seek out the different types of wildlife which inhabit the islands.

DAY 10

Fly to the mainland, connect with international flight home.

Disembark and fly back to the mainland for your international flight home.

ESSENTIALS

TRANSPORT

2 flights (longest 3hrs); 8 day cruise.

ACCOMMODATION

This holiday incorporates a small mid-range hotel and a small motor yacht in the Galápagos.

MEALS

Breakfast daily, full board days 4-9.

TRIP SUITABILITY

This holiday is suitable for all able, reasonably fit visitors.

The sea can be choppy around the Galápagos islands.

SUMMARY OF NIGHTS

10 days, 9 nights: Quito 2; Galápagos 7.

CLIMATE

In the Galápagos, from January to April it's hot and the sun is relentless, with some sudden showers. May to July, and October to December is cloudier; August and September it's often cloudy and cool, and a stiff breeze makes the waters choppier. High and Low seasons reflect demand rather than the best time to go. Many boats are in dry dock in September.

CLOTHING AND SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

For day-to-day wear you should go prepared to encounter all seasons. Trousers, skirt or shorts made from light, quick-drying synthetic materials work well on the Galápagos Islands. Long-sleeved shirts will protect you from insects and sun burn

Strong, comfortable footwear is essential and you should bring insect repellent, sun block, hat and sun glasses. You should take swimwear for ocean swimming (Galápagos). You can hire snorkelling equipment but may prefer to bring your own. Aqua-socks or rubber sandals are useful for embarking and disembarking on wet landings. Bring a light waterproof jacket in case of rain. For June to November departures, wetsuits are recommended, as the waters can be chilly for snorkelling.

Don't forget your binoculars, camera, charger and cards.

Please get in touch with the office before departure if you have any doubts. Good equipment is very important and hard to come by in South America and Galápagos.

CURRENCY

The unit of currency in Ecuador is the US dollar; in the Galápagos it is the US dollar.

HOW TO TAKE IT

Cash machines are available in all major cities and towns, and so taking a debit or credit card with a PIN number is the most convenient way of withdrawing money while on your trip, and in most shops and restaurants you can also pay by card. However, since cards can get lost, damaged, withheld or blocked, you should not rely exclusively on a card to access funds.

We recommend that additionally you take a reasonable quantity of US dollars cash (no more than is covered by your insurance), which you can spend as the dollar is the local currency, and possibly some travellers' cheques (American Express are the most widely accepted), though these are gradually falling out of use. Dollar bills should be in good condition, soiled or torn bills may be refused. You can take sterling, but the exchange rate is not always competitive or even available, restricting the number of places where you can change money.

DAILY SPEND

It is very difficult to give a guideline for essential expenses but a budget of around US\$35 per day should cover the cost of



good quality meals on those days in the holiday itinerary when not on the cruise, drinks and the odd souvenir. Eat at the very best restaurants and you will pay considerably more.

TIPPING

Tips are welcomed and local guides often rely on their tip as a significant proportion of their income.

Most service industry workers will expect a tip of some kind and so it is useful to have spare change for hotel porters, taxi drivers and the like. It is common to leave 10 - 12% in restaurants.

GUIDES

INSURANCE

Travel insurance is essential.

AIRPORT TAXES

If you have purchased your flights through Journey Latin America, the international departure tax is usually included in the ticket.

VACCINATIONS

Preventative vaccinations are recommended against the following: typhoid; polio; tetanus; hepatitis A. You should consult your GP.

For admission to the Galápagos a yellow fever certificate is required for anyone over 1 year old coming from an area with risk of yellow fever transmission.

VISAS

Holders of a full British passport do not require a visa, although passports must be valid for at least 6 months after the trip begins. Anyone with a different nationality should enquire with us or check with the relevant consulate.

If flying to the US, or via the US you will need to fill in your online ESTA application.
